Dr. Satya Ranjan Sahu is a distinguished pulmonologist and sleep medicine specialist based on Varthur Road, Bangalore. With over 18 years of clinical experience, his expertise spans advanced interventional pulmonology, critical care medicine, complex airway interventions, and sleep-disordered breathing. He serves as a Consultant - Interventional Pulmonology at Manipal Hospital, Varthur Road, delivering structured, evidence-based care for a broad spectrum of acute and chronic respiratory conditions. Dr. Sahu is widely recognised as a leading chest specialist on Varthur Road for his patient-first approach and clinical precision. Dr. Sahu earned his MBBS from Sri Ramachandra Medical College (Sri Ramachandra University), Chennai, followed by a DNB in Pulmonary Medicine from the National Institute of TB and Respiratory Diseases (NITRD), New Delhi. To strengthen his expertise in handling acute respiratory emergencies, he completed the Indian Diploma in Critical Care Medicine (IDCCM) and was awarded Membership in the National Academy of Medical Sciences (MNAMS). At Manipal Hospital Whitefield, Dr. Sahu manages a comprehensive respiratory, interventional pulmonary, and critical care suite. His

clinical expertise covers advanced diagnostic flexible bronchoscopy, transbronchial needle aspiration (TBNA), transbronchial lung biopsy (TBLB), endobronchial ultrasound (EBUS-TBNA, TBNB, and cryobiopsy), and medical thoracoscopy (rigid and semi-rigid). As a top lung specialist in Whitefield, he possesses specialised proficiency in intercostal drain insertions, foreign body extractions, airway stent placements, comprehensive pulmonary function testing (spirometry, body plethysmography, DLCO, CPET), diagnostic chest ultrasound, allergy skin prick testing with sublingual immunotherapy (SLIT), and polysomnography with CPAP/BiPAP titration for obstructive sleep apnoea. An active researcher and mentor to postgraduate trainees, Dr. Sahu has contributed textbook chapters and published papers in indexed journals such as Lung India and the Indian Journal of Critical Care Medicine (IJCCM). His published research centres on mechanical ventilation monitoring, sharp foreign body extraction, multi-drug-resistant tuberculosis (MDR-TB), and post-stent tracheal complications. He is an educator for postgraduate trainees and holds life memberships in the Indian Chest Society (ICS), European Respiratory Society (ERS), American College of Chest Physicians (CHEST), Chest Council of India (CCI), and the Indian Society of Critical Care Medicine (ISCCM).
