At Manipal Hospitals Vijayawada, Dr. Anupama's plays a key role in designing and establishing the Paediatric Cardiothoracic Intensive Care Unit (CTICU) and developing structured clinical workflows for critically ill children. Her professional interests include paediatric cardiac intensive care, ECMO, paediatric emergency medicine, bone marrow transplant critical care, AI-driven innovations in critical care, predictive analytics, digital health, and Tele-PICU models. Alongside her clinical responsibilities, Dr. Anupama is actively involved in academics, research, and medical education.
