She has clinical experience treating newborns, kids, and teenagers with asthma, food allergies, allergic rhinitis, and other allergic illnesses. She also completed a paediatrics residency and is a recognised expert in children's allergies on a global scale. Dr. Sujatha Ramesh has held a Consultant in Paediatrics position at Columbia Asia Hospitals in Hebbal and Manipal Hospitals, Yelahanka in Bengaluru. She is an American Academy of Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology fellow. She was a committee member for the New York State Asthma Guidelines and the president of the Buffalo Allergy Society.
